

FINAL PUBLIC NOTICE

The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) has received the subgrant application for Brevard County's Sea Ray Bridge repair due to damages in Hurricane Irma (DR-4337-FL PW 08588 PN 20858). Pursuant to Executive Order 11988 and 44 CFR Part 9.12, final notice is hereby given of FEMA's intent to provide funding for this project under the Public Assistance (PA) Program.

An initial disaster-wide Public Notice was published October 6th, 2017 for Hurricane Irma. Comments and other information received were fully evaluated by FEMA along with evaluation of social, economic, environmental, and safety considerations. This notice serves as a project-specific final notice for FEMA's funding action located within the floodplain.

Funding for the proposed project will be conditional upon compliance with all applicable federal, tribal, state and local laws, regulations, floodplain standards, permit requirements and conditions. This action complies with the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) requirements.

- Floodplain:** Project is located in the AE Zone, otherwise known as the area susceptible to 1% annual chance of flooding up to the Base Flood Elevation, per Brevard County FIRM Panels #12009C0340H dated 1/29/2021.
- Proposed Work and Purpose:** Brevard County proposes to repair Sea Ray Bridge by replacing bridge bents 3 and 4 up to current codes and standards.
- Project Alternatives:** FEMA has considered the no-action alternative and has determined that taking no action would likely have adverse effects on property, residents, and the community. Alternate locations were not considered as the bridge is functionally dependent upon its location within the floodplain.
- Comments:** This will serve as the final public notice regarding the above-described action funded by the FEMA PA program.
