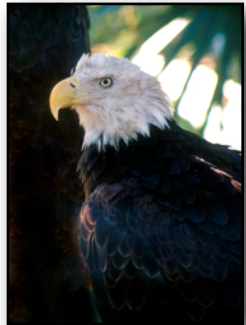


# Grant Flatwoods Sanctuary

Healthy wetlands are an important habitat for the survival of many species

The Grant Flatwoods Sanctuary is part of a network of Sanctuaries established by the Environmentally Endangered Lands program. Acquired in 2001, this 2,260-acre Sanctuary is managed for species conservation and habitat preservation.



Wetlands provide a home for a wide variety of species. Within this Sanctuary, Land Managers are working hard to restore wetland areas that have been altered. Historically, ditches, canals, and drainage systems were

put in place to create farm lands. This reduction of wetland habitat had a great impact on the area's wildlife.

Many species depend on the wetlands for food, water, and shelter. Birds that can be found here include; Bald Eagle, Turkey Vulture, and Great Blue Heron. This Sanctuary is a great place for bird watching, as well as hiking, and horseback riding.
