

Save Our Indian River Lagoon Project Plan February 2024 Progress Report

WORK COMPLETED THIS MONTH:

- Leaky Lateral Repairs 557 of 649 code enforcement cases for detected private sewer leaks have been resolved; 79 grant applications have been received; 68 payments have been processed
- Quick Connects 34 more reimbursements processed of 231 to date; 402 agreements executed
- Septic Upgrades 8 more reimbursements processed of 234 to date; 412 total agreements executed
- South Central C Septic-to-Sewer Construction complete!
- Renewed derelict vessel removal contract; removals start again in February
- University of Central Florida conducted 6-month monitoring of oyster treatments at McNabb Park, finding oysters that have survived and are growing
- Grant Applications Submitted 1 proposal to the National Fish and Wildlife Foundation to start a citizen science stormwater pond monitoring and management program
- Contracts Marketing Talent Network (MTN) public outreach contract renewal & task order extended

- Micco Sewer Line Extension 95% complete; final segment of sewer line installation is awaiting FDOT clearance; preparing for lift station start - up, then send connection notifications to owners
- Brevard County Septic-to-Sewer South Banana Zone B and Merritt Island Zone F in permitting; preparing Sykes Creek Zone N and South Beaches Zones O & P for bidding; 75% design review complete for North Merritt Island Zone E; 75% design under review for Sykes Creek M; 75% design underway for Micco Zone B, Sykes Creek Zones R & T; 30% design underway for Sharpes Zones A & B, Cocoa Zone C, South Central Zone D, and Merritt Island Zones C & G
- Sand Point Baffle Box is delivered, and construction is underway
- Basin 1304 W Arlington and Basin 1280 Flamingo bid docs are being prepared
- Stormwater water quality samples collected from 9 potential project basins
- Basin 71 Flounder Creek, Kingsmill-Aurora Ph II, Sand Dollar Canal, and Pioneer Rd have received grants
- Grand Canal Muck Dredging Dredging operations on hold during manatee closure season
- Sykes Creek Phase 1 Muck Dredging Restoration of the Phase 1 sediment handling site is underway
- Sykes Creek Phase 2 Muck Dredging –Land clearing at the Phase 2 sediment handling site is underway
- Eau Gallie Muck Dredging Finalizing Contractor Bid package
- Canaveral South Muck Dredging GHD tasked to evaluate sediment management alternatives
- Indian Harbour Beach Muck Dredging permit received; setting up meeting to transfer to the city
- Satellite Beach Muck Dredging permit received; setting up meeting to transfer to the city
- Titusville Causeway Multitrophic Restoration Project permit received; evaluating bid response
