

Save Our Indian River Lagoon Project Plan December 2024 Progress Report

WORK COMPLETED THIS MONTH:

- 2025 Plan Update draft
- Citizen Oversight Committee Applications are being accepted through December 20th
- Quick Connects 9 more reimbursements processed of 401 to date; 516 agreements executed
- Brevard County Sykes Creek Zone M, N & T Septic-to-Sewer construction bid awarded to Hinterland
- Septic Upgrades 14 more reimbursements processed of 341 to date; 565 total agreements executed
- Brevard Zoo Oyster Reefs first module of the Melbourne Offshore project is constructed
- University of Central Florida completed 18-month monitoring at McNabb Oyster gabions seeded with gardened oysters had an average density of 36.6 oysters per square meter and oyster gabions seeded with spat-on-shell had an average density of 29.6 oysters per square meter, with no evidence of new recruitment
- Contracts executed #24-187 Central IRL Oyster 3 and #24-217 Central IRL Oyster 4
- Derelict Vessels 2 Vessel Removed
- Education and Outreach Spark Tide Outreach Task Order is complete

- South Central C Septic-to-Sewer 140 of 151 homeowner connections completed
- South Beaches A Septic to Sewer 1 of 37 connections completed; 21 of 37 connection agreements executed
- Micco Septic-to-Sewer 1 of 29 parcels connected
- Brevard County Septic-to-Sewer South Banana Zone B, and South Beaches Zones O & P are in the bid que
- Brevard County Septic-to-Sewer 100% design received and state permit applications submitted for Merritt Island Zones F & C; 75% design in review for Cocoa Zone C and Sharpes Zone B; 75% design underway for Sykes Creek Zones R, North Merritt Island Zone E, and South Central D; 30% design underway for Sharpes Zones A, Micco Zone B, and Merritt Island Zones G; preliminary design started and homeowner letters sent for South Central Zone A
- Brevard County Stormwater Basin 1304 West Arlington Provided limited Notice to Proceed to secure materials with estimated start date in January 2025
- Brevard County Stormwater Basin 71 Flounder Shop drawings being reviewed
- Brevard County Stormwater Basin 958 Pioneer Road Awaiting contract execution to issue Notice to Proceed
- Grand Canal Muck Dredging dredging stopped on 11/26 for manatee shutdown period; 439,110 CY dredged
- Eau Gallie Muck Dredging Invitation to Bid went out on 11/27; Pre-Bid meeting scheduled for 12/12
- Sykes Creek Phase 2 Muck Dredging Bid Technical Specifications in development for redesigned project
- Canaveral South Muck Dredging- Alternatives Assessment underway
- Titusville Causeway Multi-Trophic Restoration & Living Shorelines Resiliency Project All Wave Attenuation Devices are poured; staging area established to begin barging and placing in the nearshore
- Seagrass and Oyster Restoration Resilience Project Herbivory Excluders have been reinstalled or replaced
- Contracts State grant L0010 Septic Upgrades and 3 amendments in review
- Videos Community Challenge Garden: two filmed & in editing and one scheduled
